75th Anniversary: Looking Back to the Beginning

Do you know why we're called Rotary?

As we celebrate our 75th anniversary, we'll look back on documents, newsletters, photos and much more to learn and remember together.

The original Rotary Club grew out of the loneliness of a young lawyer in Chicago who yearned to recapture the small-town camaraderie once enjoyed by the local doctor and lawyer, butcher, baker, and candlestick maker. In February of 1905, Paul P. Harris invited a group of men, each representing a different business or profession, to form a club which met socially at each member's place of business in rotation: hence the name ROTARY. As new members were invited, however, the group became too large to continue this practice, and soon they instituted the custom, still followed today, of gathering at a restaurant for lunch once each week.
